


Welcome to Edinburgh!


The city

Edinburgh, Scotland's capital, is a UNESCO city of Literature and UNESCO World Heritage Site. The city is a cultural centre with beautiful architecture, natural landscapes, as well as amazing cafes and restaurants.

Landmarks

• Edinburgh Castle

Perched atop Castle Rock overlooking the city, this should be a must-see on your list of places to visit in Edinburgh. Edinburgh Castle houses important Scottish artefacts, such as the Honours of Scotland (the oldest crown jewels in the UK) and The Stone of Destiny, an ancient symbol of the Scottish monarchy.



Calton Hill



For outstanding views, get up early and climb to the top of Calton Hill to enjoy the sunrise over the city. The UNESCO World Heritage Site is home to a collection of historic monuments, most notably the National Monument, which was inspired by the Parthenon in Athens.



• Dean Village

Dean Village is a cherished beauty spot within the heart of Edinburgh. Nestled along the tranquil Water of Leith, Dean Village traces its origins to the Water of Leith Village, a milling community founded in the 12th century.





• Arthur's Seat

Arthur's Seat (Scottish Gaelic: Suidhe Artair) is an ancient volcano which is the main peak of the group of hills in Edinburgh, which form most of Holyrood Park, described by Robert Louis Stevenson as "a hill for magnitude, a mountain in virtue of its bold design".
